2.1 Code of Professional Ethics

Seshadripuram First Grade College has a Code of Professional Ethics, helping to guide its members in performing their job functions according to sound and consistent ethical principles. - Render all assigned duties by the institution in the form of teaching, the conduct of examination, evaluation, admission process, mentoring, organizing curricular, co- curricular, and extracurricular events and research work conscientiously and with full involvement.

- Desist from inciting and mobilizing students towards any violent or illegal activities.

2.4 Teachers and Teaching Fraternity

Teachers should:

- Have a cordial relation with their peers and other members of the institution and should respect human dignity and privacy.
- Behave respectfully with all the members of the institution, with professionalism.
- Respect the institutional hierarchy and refrain from lodging unnecessary complaints and allegations against individuals.

Teachers should:


- Maintain cordial relations with the non-teaching staff, and should cooperate with them in the academic and administrative processes of the institution.
